About Lekha Mendha:

Situated in Gadchiroli District of the Maharashtra State (India), the village of Mendha-Lekha is famous for its bio-diverse, dry deciduous forest, but also for the struggle of its tribal community towards self-rule. Nearly 80% of the village area is forested and under the legally recognized control of the village. The village has approximately 400 residents, all belonging to the Gond tribe. Mendha Lekha in Gadchiroli district will become the first village in the country to exercise its community right to harvest bamboo under the Forest Rights Act.
