DD (Delivering Democracy) Campus 20 - Democracy Unlimited (A G20 - Civil 20 Delivering Democracy WG Initiative)

CONTEXT:

Campus20 is an initiative under the G20-C20 Working Group 'Delivering Democracy' to augment youth participation in democracy. As per India Youth Development Report 2017 Political participation index is 0.436 and civic engagement index is 0.191. Assuming that this has changed for the better in the last few years, there is still significant opportunities to furtherF the same. The DDCampus20 initiative recognizes the importance of engaging young people in the democratic process and aims to empower them to become active citizens. C20 working group on Delivering Democracy is signing up with 20 universities across the country to implement 'DDCampus 20 — Democracy Unlimited' on their campuses.

OBJECTIVES:

The specific objectives of DDCampus20 are:

- Provide a platform for youth to engage with G20 during India's Presidency
- Encourage young people to participate in the democratic process and increase their awareness about democratic institutions and responsibilities.
- Foster civic education, democratic values and social responsibility among youth and enable them to be active citizens
- Strengthen social cohesion and encourage inclusive participation in democracy.
- Provide a platform for universities to showcase their commitment to civic engagement and social responsibility.
- Foster partnerships and collaboration among universities and other organizations to promote democracy.

How can you participate?

You can conduct the activities listed below on any one of the days between 01st April to 31st May 2023. Delivering Democracy Working Group should be updated at least a week before about the scheduled event.

For each of the activities that the University is participating, we request the University to create photo documentation capturing key reactions, actions on ground during the contest, problems identified with solutions worked out, and any other detail which will add value to this document.

University is allowed to use the G20 | C20 logo with your institution logo for activities conducted under the C20. The best shortlisted entries will participate in the national contest as detailed in the note nelow

The Delivering democracy WG's Campus20 team will guide and support Universities throughout the implementation process from time to time.

ACTIVITIES AND THEIR IMPLEMENTATION DETAILS:

1. Poster-Making competition

Themes for the Poster:

Nothing like voting! Vote for sure – How youth can catalyze increased voter participation in the elections.

Judging criteria

Posters may be judged based on creativity / novelty of the idea or solution, aesthetic elements of presentation, and relevance to the theme.

Following weightage will be given to different parameters

- solution being provided to the problem / progress -40%
- creative / novelty of the idea or solution -20%
- logical presentation of idea/solution -20%
- aesthetic elements/design -20%

Rewards:

From the College:

Certification of Recognition for submitting the poster or taking part in the event Special Certification / reward for top 3 contenders

From the Delivering Democracy Working Group – G20 C20:

- The 20 best posters (out of 60 posters received by 20 campuses) across all themes will be published in the form of a Coffee Table book by G20-C20-Democracy Working Group and each poster creator will get a special citation (certificate) by the Secretariat of Delivering Democracy WG
- The 20 best posters would be rewarded with a Certificate and a memento (possibly in final event of C20 or virtual event)
- All posters submitted (i.e. top three from each University) will get a participation ecertificate
- The 20 best posters submitted before 31st March 2023 will get a chance to be showcased during a National Conference on 'Delivering Democracy – Retrospect and Prospect' and







Best THREE will be Awarded in the Conference (this can be done without organising the event – can be directly sent by the campuses)

• Poster Presenters will get an opportunity to take part in the two days conference.

General Instructions

- Each participant can submit only one poster per theme.
- Participant's name should be mentioned clearly at the bottom right corner of the poster.
- Participants can make the poster with handmade art or digital art or a combination of the two.
- Inappropriate or offensive language and images will automatically disqualify the submission.
- All content must be original. No trademarked images or logo or copyrighted images may be used.
- Poster size: A3 (11.7" x 16.5") with 0.5" margins on all sides drawn with a black pen/marker.
- Digital art should be in jpeg format with 300 DPI (Dots per inch) or a print resolution of 3508 pixels x 4961 pixels.
- All mediums (pencil, sketch pens, watercolours, crayons, oil paint etc.) can be used for handmade art) and a variety of textures may be used for digital art.
- Infographics are allowed.
- Any editing program may be used for digital art.
- Each artwork must be submitted along with a short description of the poster.
- Problem statement can be captured as a text paragraph, the solution can be depicted through poster design

Eg(generated using ChatGPT)

Problem: Low youth participation in democracy - Young people have the potential to shape the future of their communities and countries. However, many youth feel disengaged from the political process, resulting in low youth participation in democratic processes such as voting and civic engagement.

Solution: Empowering youth through education and participation

- Education: Increase civic education in schools and provide resources for youth to learn about the political process and their rights and responsibilities as citizens.
- Participation: Encourage youth to get involved in political campaigns, community service projects, and other civic activities that help them engage in the democratic process.







Visuals: The poster features a series of images of young people participating in civic activities, such as volunteering, attending town hall meetings, and voting. The images are accompanied by bold, attention-grabbing text that highlights the problem and solution, and encourages youth to get involved in the democratic process.

Call to action: The poster includes a call to action for young people to register to vote, get involved in local political campaigns, and join civic organizations in their communities. It also provides resources for learning more about the democratic process and how to get involved.

2. Poem Writing Competition

Theme

The broad theme for poem writing is "Strengthening Democracy through Youth Participation", participants can further narrow down the scope to specific aspects of democracy. University can guide them in this process

Judging Criteria

Selection will be based on adherence to the theme, the literary value of the work, poetic technique, and creativity.

Following weightage will be given to different parameters

- Literary value of the work -40%
- Poetic techniques -20%
- Adherence to theme -20%
- Creativity -20%.

Rewards

From among all submissions made nationally, a panel of the working group, consisting of writers, will shortlist the top 20 poems.







The top 20 poems will appear in the compendium of poems by G20-C20-Democracy Working Group and each poem creator will get a special citation (certificate) by the Secretariat of Delivering Democracy WG

The 20 best poems across all themes would be rewarded with a Certificate and a memento (possibly in final event of C20 or in the virtual event). All poem submitted will get a participation e-certificate (i.e., three tops from each University/school).

General instructions:

- Please note that the poem can be written in English or any Indian regional language.
- Poem should have a title, and can be written in any poetic style
- Contest entries must be at least 4 but cannot exceed 40 lines (including stanza breaks) and
 cannot exceed 55 characters per line (including spaces between words). Any submission
 that exceeds these limits will be automatically disqualified. The poem title does not count
 as a line.
- Poems containing language that is vulgar, offensive, or wholly inappropriate will be disqualified.
- A poem in its entirety must be an original work by the person entering the contest.
- The poet's name should appear at the end of every poem towards the bottom right

From all the submissions, universities should shortlist the top three poems and submit a scanned PDF to **ddcampus20g20@graam.org.in** by May 20th, 2023. Each submission should be accompanied by a video recording of the author reciting his/her poem.

3. #MyStanceOnDemocracy - social media campaign

Theme

The objective of this contest is to encourage students and academicians to create a social media campaign on the theme "How can a country move towards a more strong and inclusive democracy? And Role of Youth in Strengthening and Deepening Democracy.







This Social Media Campaign will bring people from all walks of life to share their opinion on the current challenges in democracy and the solution for the same. Student can make a reel/tweet / post using to voice his/her stance on democracy (what does democracy mean to the individual).

Campaign timeline

April 1st - May30th

Judging Criteria

Content and creativity

Rewards

- Best 3 Posts will be recommended by the campaign committee of the University based on the content and creativity.
- Best 20 videos (received 03 each from 20 University) will be compiled by Delivering Democracy WG, and will be submitted to G20 Secretariat
- O Videos will also be recognised through participation certificate and 20
- Videos go in to the compilation will get reward and special certification of appreciation by the Delivering Democracy WG G20 C20
- Colleges can recognise / reward all participation and three best videos / posts

General instructions

Students should be encouraged to record a video (60 seconds) in which they speak about what democracy means to them and share with the campaign team of the University Content should capture their view on democracy, and not necessarily have any reference to the working of the government or political ideology

Committee will upload (after verifying the appropriateness of the content) the videos on their official social media platforms from 01st April to 30th May 2023.

Model G20

General instructions

The Model 20 should be held in two parallel tracks the finance track and the sherpa track.

Separate deliberations should be conducted in both these tracks, once these deliberations are over. These two tracks should merge to form the final track which is the leader's summit.

The Finance Team & the Sherpa Track should discuss only select 2 issues in each track. The topic selection will be guided by the University. Track discussion should lead to solutions/policy suggestions. The track delegation should simulate the team structure of the real g20 working groups.

Each delegation must comprise 5-7 members. The composition of the delegate team can have

- 1. Leader to head the delegation throughout the Summit.
- 2. a Sherpa and Sous Sherpa (deputy) in the sherpa track
- 3. a Finance Minister and a Central Bank Governor (deputy).- in the finance track.

6th and 7th delegates in a delegation will act as "Senior Advisors" and will work with both the Finance and Sherpa Tracks.

A final session of the Model G20 Summit to be conducted after this, all participants in both tracks should come together and replicate the real G20 Leaders' Summit where discussion deliberation will lead to draft policy recommendations

Along with the draft policy recommendations, a video documentation of the entire model G20 at the University should be submitted to <u>ddcampus20g20@graam.org.in</u> by the 20th May 2023

Rewards

From within all submissions made, 1 winner and 2 runners-up will be selected for each of the following awards. Selection will be based on issues identified and deliberations as captured in the video submitted by the University.

- Outstanding Sherpa Track deliberation
- Outstanding Finance Track deliberation
- Best policy recommendation

Award winners would be rewarded with a Certificate and a memento (possibly in final event of C20)







The top 5 policy recommendations will appear in the compendium of recommendations by G20-C20-Democracy Working Group and each policy creator will get a special citation (certificate) by the Secretariat of Delivering Democracy WG.

5. Essay Competition

Themes

- 1. Inclusive Democracy how can we involve the marginalized in democracy and governance.
- 2. Increasing Political Participation of Youth barriers and solutions
- 3. Leveraging ICTs to strengthen democracy the way forward.

Judging criteria

Essays will be judged based on language and literary style, creativity / novelty of the ideas or solutions, effectiveness in presenting a point of view, and relevance to the theme.

Following weightage will be given to different parameters

- effectiveness in presenting a point of view -30%
- language and literary style -20%
- relevance to the theme -20%
- creativity/ novelty of the ideas/solutions -30%.

Rewards

The 3 best essays across each theme will be published as part of a Essay Compendium by G20-C20-Democracy Working Group and their authors will get a special citation (certificate) by the Secretariat of Delivering Democracy WG

Original ideas and solutions will be highlighted in the above mentioned coffee table book, with due citation to the authors.

All essays will get a participation e-certificate.

General Instructions

Each participant can submit only one essay per theme.

Each essay should have a title.







The following details should be mentioned clearly at the end of each essay: Name of Author, Age of Author, University / Institution, course details.

Inappropriate, derogatory, or offensive language will automatically disqualify the submission. The essay should be solution oriented.

All content must be original.

Infographics are allowed.

Minimum 700 words and maximum – 1000 words (excluding infographics)

The essay must be typed out.

Out of all the submissions, University should shortlist 3 essays and submit scanned .pdf files to ddcampus20g20@graam.org.in

Timeline for submission will be on or before 15th May 2023
