Ordinance No 49 of 2017.

EXAMINATIONS LEADING TO THE DEGREE OF MASTER OF FASHION DESIGN IN THE FACULTY OF HOME SCIENCE, (CREDIT BASED SEMESTER SYSTEM PATTERN) ORDINANCE, 2017.

Whereas, it is expedient to provide an Ordinance in respect of Examination Leading to the Degree of **Master of Fashion Design**, in the Faculty of Home Science, (Credit Based Semester Pattern) for the purposes hereinafter appearing, the Management council is hereby pleased to make the following Ordinance :-

1. This Ordinance may be called "Examinations Leading to the Degree of Master of Fashion Design in the Faculty of Home Science (Credit Based Semester Pattern) Ordinance, 2016."
2. This Ordinance shall come into force with effect from the date of its making by the Management Council.
3. The duration of the Master of Fashion Design course shall be of Two Academic years consisting of Four semester with University examinations at the end of each semester namely :
 - a) Master of Fashion Design, Semester I Exam.
 - b) Master of Fashion Design, Semester II Exam.
 - c) Master of Fashion Design, Semester III Exam.
 - d) Master of Fashion Design, Semester IV Exam.
4. The examinations shall be held at such places and dates which are notified by the University.

ELIGIBILITY TO THE COURSE:

5. Subject to his compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance and any other Ordinances in force from time to time, an applicant for admission to the examination shall have passed.

A three years degree course examination in Bachelor of Fashion Design from Gondwana University or Bachelor degree in Fashion Design / B.Sc. Home Science/Garment Technology/ B.Sc in Fashion Design /B.A with Fashion Design or any other equivalent examination from any recognized University in India or abroad or BFA/Graduation in Textile Design, Textile Science / Handloom Technology or Equivalent / Graduates in Fashion Accessories, Apparel Merchandising / Graduate in any discipline with one year relevant Garment ,Textile industry experience , one or two years diploma or certificate course in Fashion Design, garment technology, fashion technology/Dress Designing, Dress Making.

6. a) **Master of Fashion Design Semester-I Examination**

Students who have fulfilled the eligibility criteria as mentioned in para 5 above shall be admitted to Semester I of this course.

b) The ATKT rules for admission for the Master of Fashion Design Course (Theory and Practical as separate passing head) shall be as given in the following table-

admission to semester	Candidates should have passed in all subjects of the following examination	Candidates should have passed at least two third of the passing heads of the following examinations
Sem I	----	-----
Sem II	-----	Candidate having appeared in at least 01 theory subject of I st semester Examination
Sem III	---	Candidate having passed in 50% subject of I st semester & II nd semester each.
Sem IV	----	Candidate having passed 50% subject of I st semester & II nd semester each and appeared in at least 01 theory paper of III rd semester examination.

- As mentioned in the para 5 above.

7. The duration of the course leading to the Master of Fashion Design in the Faculty of Home Science shall be of four semesters (two years). The examination pattern will be as follows.

- Semester Examination** The examination shall be held twice every year for Part I and Part II at the places and on the dates prescribed by the university.
 - Viva -Voce Examination**-The Viva-Voce shall be held at the end of part fourth semester on completion of Research Project for which external examiner shall be appointed for conduction of Viva ±Voce on such date as fixed by the university.
 - Internship:-The internship of two week shall be completed after the completion of first year academic session during vacation** Evaluation of two week internship report will be conducted at the college level.
 - The Adhoc teachers/subject experts from Fashion/garment industry teaching to the said course can be assigned as guide for guiding the research based project work.
8. Without prejudice to other provisions of Ordinance No. 6 relating to the examination in general, provisions of Para 5, 8, 9, 10, 26, 31 and 32 of the said Ordinance shall apply to every student admitted to this course.

9. The fees for the tuition, examination, laboratory and other fees shall be as prescribed by the university from time to time.
10. (a) The scope of the subjects shall be as prescribed in the syllabus.
(b) The medium of instruction and examination shall be English.
11. The number of papers and maximum marks assigned to each paper and minimum marks/grade, an examinee must obtain in order to pass the examination shall be as prescribed in Appendix-I, Appendix-II, Appendix-III and Appendix-IV appended with this Ordinance.
12. The examinee at each of the examination shall have option of not being declared successful at the examination in case he/she does not secure a minimum of grade equivalent to 55% marks at the examination. This option will have to be exercised every time when the application is submitted to any of the examinations. Once this option is exercised, shall be binding on the examinee and it shall not be evoked under any circumstances.
13. The classification of the examinee successful at the end of final semester examination shall be as based on credit grade system as prescribed in appendices, appended with this Ordinance.
14. The provisions of ordinance for the award of grace marks for passing an examination, securing higher grade in subject(s) as updated from time to time shall apply to the examination under this Ordinance.
15. The names of the successful examinees passing the examination as a whole in the minimum prescribed period and obtaining prescribed number of places securing the grades equivalent to first and second division shall be arranged in order of merit as provided in Ordinance 6 relating to examinations in general
16. No candidate shall be admitted to an examination under this Ordinance, if he/she has already passed the same examination of this university or of any other university.
17. Examinee successful at the final examination shall, on payment of the prescribed fees, be entitled for the award of the degree in the prescribed form signed by the Vice-chancellor.
18. This course is based on credit based semester pattern therefore, it will be regulated by processing of examination result and subsequent declaration for all the courses employing semester based credit grade system, Ordinance and table 1 under Appendix – A of the said Ordinance.

(Statement of object and reasons)

The Vice-Chancellor of the university had issued Direction No. 150 of 2012 on 5/9/2012 in respect of Direction Governing the Examinations leading to the Degree of Master of Fashion Design in the faculty of social sciences, under provision of section 14 (8) of the Maharashtra university Act, 1994.

The subject matter of the Direction is required to be regulated by an Ordinance as provided under the Act.

In view of the above, the existing Direction is required to be converted into an Ordinance as provided under the Act, hence this Draft Ordinance is prepared for consideration of the Academic council and the Management council.
