



**Ordinance No. 62 Of 2017**

**Processing of Examination Result and Subsequent Declaration for all the Courses Employing Semester Based Credit Grade System. Ordinance, 2017.**

**Whereas**, it is expedient to provide an ordinance in respect of Processing of Examination Result and Subsequent Declaration for all the Courses Employing Semester Based Credit Grade System, for the purposes hereinafter appearing, the Management council is hereby pleased to make the following ordinance :-

1. This ordinance may be called ‘Processing of Examinations Result and Subsequent Declaration for all the Courses Employing Semester Based Credit Grade System , ordinance, 2017.’
2. This ordinance shall come into force with effect from the date of its making by the management council.
3. In this ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires,
  - i. an “Examinee” means the student/candidate who has appeared for full or part of the university examination towards award of Certificate/ Diploma/ Degree/Post Graduation Degree as the case may be.
4. As per the adopted model Credit Grade System, the computation of Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) of an examinee indicating his performance shall follow in the steps given below-
  - a) Marks scored by examinee in the given examination shall include college Assessment and University Assessment either Theory subjects or Practical or both.
  - b) The total marks thus obtained for each of the passing heads shall be converted into Grades as per the Grade tables of the concerned program appended with this ordinance as Appendix - A.
  - c) SGPA shall be calculated as given below based on the Grade Points corresponding to the Grade as given in the table of the respective program and the Credits allotted to the head of passing i.e. theory or practical as shown in the program scheme of the respective examination.(Appendix – A)

$$SGPA = \frac{C_1 XG_1 + C_2 XG_2 \dots \dots \dots C_n XG_n}{C_1 + C_2 \dots \dots \dots C_n}$$

Where,  $C_{1.....n}$  - No. of Credits of individual course  
 $G_{1.....n}$  -Grade points obtained in the respective course

5. If the given examinee fails in all the heads of passing, his SGPA for the given examination shall be ‘Zero’ and that the examinee will be declared as ‘Fail’ in the given examination.

6. If the given examinee is declared unsuccessful i.e. fails in one or more heads of passing, in the case his SGPA will be estimated indicating his performance in the given examination and the result will be 'Fail'.
7. If the examinee remains absent in any one of the examination either theory or practical, his SGPA shall be estimated and the examinee will be declared as 'Fail'.
8. If the examinee remains absent in examination of all the heads of passing, in the case his SGPA shall not be estimated and that the result of the examinee will be declared as 'Absent'.
9. Provision regarding Grace marks for passing in a particular head and Condonation of Deficiency of marks for a given passing head for all the programs offered by the University shall not be applicable.
10. Provisions in respect of Incentive marks for NCC, NSS, Games, Sports and other Extra-Curricular & Cultural Activities to the collegiate students of undergraduate examinations of all the Faculties shall be applicable as per the concerned University ordinance.
11. Students studying in Govt. / Govt. aided / Professional and Non-Professional / Colleges under Non-Agricultural Universities / Engineering / Polytechnics and Teachers Training Colleges having Dyslexia, Dyscalculia and Dysgraphia which are being included as students with '**Learning Disability**' vide Circular No USC 2004/(86/04) Extra ord. 4, Department of Higher and Technical Education, Govt. of Maharashtra dated 7th August'2004, who have failed in the examination, should be given **a maximum of 20 marks as "Grace Marks (Including all Subjects)"** for passing as a part of concession mentioned in para. (6) of the aforesaid circular.
12. The result of the examinee for the given examination shall be issued in the form of 'Grade sheet' indicating his performance based on parameters defined in the adopted Model Credit Grade System.
13. The Grade sheet shall consist of various terms of use called abbreviations which shall mean otherwise, as indicated in the table given below.

SGPA	Semester Grade Point Average indicating performance of the examinee in the given examination
AA	Absent in the examination of given passing head
EUC	Exempted in University as well as College assessment i.e. full exemption
EU	Exempted in University assessment only
EC	Exempted in College assessment only
Q	Qualified in the given passing head
NQ	Not Qualified in the given passing head
PXM	Previous exemption
WLS	Withheld for lower stage

### **(Statement of object and reasons)**

The Vice-chancellor of the university had issued Direction No. 153 of 2012 & 171 of 2014 on 21/12/2012 & 1/8/2014 respectively in respect of Direction governing Processing of Examination Result and Subsequent declaration for all the Courses Employing Semester Based Credit Grade System from the year 2012-13 and onwards, under provision of section 14 (8) of the Maharashtra university Act, 1994.

The subject matter of the Direction is required to be regulated by an ordinance as provided under the Act.

In view of the above, the existing Direction No. 171 which has repealed/ Direction No. 153 is required to be converted into an ordinance as provided under the Act, hence this Draft ordinance is prepared for consideration of the Academic council and the Management council.
