EXAMINATIONS LEADING TO THE DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF LAWS (B.A.L.L.B.) (TEN SEMESTER DEGREE COURSE) BASED ON CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM IN THE FACULTY OF HUMANITIES DIRECTION, 2017.

(Issued under Provision of Section 12(8) of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016.)

Whereas, The Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 has come into force with effect from 1st March 2017(Maharashtra Act No. VI of 2017)(hereinafter referred to as the Act);

AND

Whereas, the above mentioned Act is applicable to the Gondwana University, Gadchiroli from 1st March, 2017;

AND

Whereas, the chairman, U.G.C. New Delhi has directed the Vice-Chancellor of the university to initiate steps for successful implementation of the choice based credit system(CBCS) from the Academic Session 2015-16 vide letter D.O.No.F-1-1/2015(CM) dated 8/01/2015;

AND

Whereas, the U.G.C. has formulated and issued guidelines on adoption of choice based credit system in all the universities;

AND

Whereas, the vice-chancellor has directed, on the basis of the resolution of the authorities of the university, to formulate and introduce choice based credit system at U.G. and P.G. level programme in all the faculties in the university;

AND

Whereas, the matter to introduce choice based credit system is required to be regulated by an ordinance to be made in this behalf;

AND

Whereas, no Ordinance is in existence in the university for introducing choice based credit system in the faculty of Humanities;

AND

Whereas, making of an Ordinance for introducing choice based credit system in the faculty of Humanities is a time consuming process;

AND

Whereas, the choice based credit system is to be introduced at the Bachelor of Laws Degree level in the faculty of Humanities from the Academic year 2017-18.

Now, therefore, I, Dr. N. V. Kalyankar, Vice-Chancellor, Gondwana University, Gadchiroli in exercise of the powers vested in me under provision of section 12(8) of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act,2016 do hereby issue following Directions:-

- 1. This Direction shall be called "Examinations leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Laws (LL.B.) (Ten semester Degree Course) based on Choice based credit system in the faculty of Humanities, Direction, 2017."
- 2. This Direction shall come into force with effect from the Academic year 2017-18 for Ist and IInd semester of the Bachelor degree course and onwards i.e. Bachelor of Laws Degree.
- 3. Duration of the Programme: The duration of the programme shall be 5 academic years which spread over 10 semesters with the University Examination at the end of each Semester.

Each Academic Year shall be divided into Two semesters. The academic year for Odd semesters (1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th& 9th) will commence as far as possible from 1st of July, while Even Semester (2nd, 4th 6th, 8th& 10th) will commence from 1st of January every year.

An examination for each of the semester shall be held twice in a year at such places and on such dates as may be fixed by the University. The fees for the examination shall be as prescribed by the University from time to time.

- **4.** Unless the context otherwise requires, the following words shall have the meaning as assigned to them in this direction.
 - (a) Academic Year: Two consecutive (one odd + one even) semesters constitute one academic year.
 - (b) ATKT: means Allowed to Keep Term in Higher Semester as per the provisions of this direction.

- (c) Choice Based Credit System (CBCS): Choice Based Credit System provides choice for students to select from the prescribed courses
- (d) Course: It is equivalent to a paper/subject in a programme. It is a complete unit of learning which will be taught and evaluated within a Semester. All courses need not carry the same weight. A course may be designed to comprise lecturing/tutorial/laboratory work/fieldwork/outreach activities/project work/vocationaltraining/viva/seminars/termpapers/assignmen ts/presentations/self-study etc. or a combination of some of these.

The UGC guidelines on CBCS system prescribe three kinds of courses: Core, Elective and Foundation in a programme.

Core Course (CC): This is the course/subject which is to be compulsorily studied by a student as a core requirement to complete the programme. It shall be related to the disciple of study.

Elective Course (EC): Elective course is a course which can be chosen from a pool of prescribed papers. An elective courses may be "Generic Elective" focusing on those courses which add generic proficiency to the students. An elective may be "Discipline Centric" or may be chosen from an unrelated discipline. It may be called as "Open Elective".

Foundation Course: The Foundation Courses may be of two kinds, *Compulsory Foundation(FC)* and *Elective Foundation(FE)*. "Compulsory Foundation" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. They are mandatory for all disciplines. "Elective Foundation" courses are value based, and are aimed at man-making education.

Foundation Courses are of two types

- i) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course(AECC)
- ii) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)
- (e) Credit:Credit means the unit by which the course work is measured. It is measured in terms of weekly class hours assigned to a Course. One Credit is equivalent to 15 hours of teaching work (Lecture or tutorial) and is equivalent to 25 marks in the transcript.

- Credit Point (CP): It is the value obtained by multiplying the Grade Point by the Credit i.e No. of Credits assigned for the course x Grade Points secured for that course.
- Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): CGPA means the value obtained by dividing total number of credit points in all the semesters by the total number of credits in all the semesters. It is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a student over all semesters.
- (h) Grade Letter : Grade Letter means an index to indicate the performance of a student in a particular course/ Paper. It is the transformation of actual marks secured by a student in a course/paper into a letter grade. There shall be a range of marks for each Grade
- (i) Grade Point: Grade Point means weightage allotted to each grade letter.
- Programme: It means the Fives Year integrated degree course of bachelor of laws (B.A.LL.B) of study and examination spread over ten semesters, the successful completion of which would lead to the award of Five year integrated degree of bachelor of laws (B.A.LL.B).
- Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): It means the value obtained by dividing the total credit points earned by a student in all the courses of a given semester by the total number of credits assigned to that semester. It is a measure of performance of work done in a semester.
- Transcript or Grade Card or Certificate: Based on the grade earned, a grade certificate shall be issued to all the registered students after every semester. The grade certificate will display the course details (code, title, number of credits, grade secured) along with SGPA of that semester and CGPA earned till that semester.
- Eligibility (a) Admission to the programme shall be made on the basis of merit by the respective college admission committee and in accordance with the rules and instructions provided from time to time by Bar Council of India. The reservation policy and rules of the Government of Maharashtra governing admission to higher educational institutions issued from time to time shall also be followed.
 - b) An applicant who has successfully completed 10+2 or Intermediate or equivalent from a recognized University of India or outside or from a Senior Secondary Board or equivalent,

constituted or recognized by the Union or by a State Government or from any equivalent institution from a foreign country recognized by the government of that country for the purpose of issue of qualifying certificate on successful completion of the course, may apply for and be admitted into the B.A. LL.B. (5 Year) Degree Course.

- c) Students who secures minimum 45% of the total marks in the qualifying examination are eligible for admission into the programme. As per the Bar Council of India, New Delhi directions vide letter No. BCI:D:1379:2002(LE:Affln.), dated 2-8-2002, the 44.5% can be rounded off to 45%.
- **d)** For S.C & S.T students, Minimum 40% of the total marks in their qualifying examination is required for admission into the Programme.
- e) If Common Admission Test for admission into five year B.A.LL.B course is prescribed by Government of Maharashtra, the admission into the programme shall be governed by the rules and regulations framed by the Government of Maharashtra from time to time.
- **6. Medium of Instruction:** The medium of instructions and Examinations shall be English. Question papers for the examinations shall be set in English. However, the candidates will have an option to write their answers either in English, Hindi or Marathi.
- **7. Attendance:** No student shall be permitted to appear for the Semester Examination unless he/she has put in not less than 75% attendance of the classes held in any course/paper concerned including tutorials, moot court exercises, practical training etc. conducted in respect of that paper/course.
- 8. Rules of A.T.K.T: Rules of A.T.K.T shall be as under:

- **9.** Instruction, Training and Teaching Work Load: Each Semester shall comprise of not less than 18 weeks with not less than 30 class-hours per week including tutorials, moot room exercises and seminars provided that there shall be at least 24 lecture hours per week.
 - a) A Class-hour shall consist of 48 minutes duration.
 - **b)** The number of classes for theory / practical/Clinical courses per week must be equal to number of credits shown against the paper as indicated in the course structure and scheme provided in APPENDIX-I of this direction.
 - c) Distribution of 20 marks for internal assessment, wherever there is a provision for internal assessment shall be as follows:
- i) First Internal Examination (Descriptive) = 5marks
- ii) Second Internal Examination (on-line/offline)
 with multiple choice questions =5marks
- iii) Seminars/Group Discussion = 5marks
- iv) Assignments/Viva-voce Examination =5 marks
- 10. Evaluation System on the basis of Credit and Grade Pattern: Based on his/her continuous evaluation, the academic performance of a student during a semester shall be graded on a Seven-point scale. The grade awarded to a student shall depend on his/her performance in external and internal examinations.

- end of the programme, shall be evaluated on the basis of:
 - (i) Grade Point (GP) obtained in each subject
 - (ii) Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA),
 - (iii) Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)
- (b) Marks for Extra Curricular Components (E.C.C)/Incentive Marks are to be awarded in recognition of achievements in Sports/Cultural/N.S.S/NCC as per the rules and instructions of the University provided in this regard from time to time.
- (c) At the end of each semester examination, a student shall be awarded a Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA). A Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) shall be awarded to each student at the end of Final Semester of the Programme. The details regarding method of calculating SGPA & CGPA is explained in detail in para 11.
- 11. Awards of Grade Letter, Grade Points, Credit Points, SGPA, CGPA:
- (a) Award of Grade Letter and Grade Points:

 Each course/paper shall be valued in Seven Grades. The letter grades and their equivalent grade points are listed below. The marks shall show only Grade Letters and not Marks for each paper.

- (a) Calculation of Credit Points (CP):-Credit Points for the course = No. of Credits assigned for the course x Grade Point secured for that course.
- (b) Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): SGPA indicates the performance of a student in a given Semester. SGPA is based on the total credit points

earned by the student in all the courses and the total number of credits assigned to the courses/papers in a Semester. SGPA shall be rounded off to two decimal points. (e.g - 6.578 rounded to 6.58 & 6.574 will be rounded to 6.57)

SGPA= <u>Total Credit Points in the Semester</u>
Total Number of Credits for the Semester

Provided that SGPA is computed only if the candidate passes in all the courses (gets a minimum 'C' Grade in all Courses).

(c) <u>Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)</u>: CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighted across all the semesters. CGPA shall be rounded to two decimal Points (e.g - 6.578 rounded to 6.58 & 6.574 will be rounded to 6.57)

Total Credit Points Obtained in all Semesters

CGPA =

Total Credits of all Semesters

Provided that CGPA is calculated only when the candidate passes in all the courses of all the semesters.

12. Standard of Passing the Semester Examinations: In order to qualify a particular examination, a candidate shall have to secure atleast 45% of marks taken together University Assessment (UA) & College Assessment (CA) in each and every theory and Practical/Clinical paper in each end semester examination.

All the examinees of University Examination including failures of examinations, shall be bound to study the Syllabus prescribed for a particular paper/subject/course as revised from time to time.

- 13. Award of the Degree: A student will be eligible for the award of five year integrated degree of bachelor of laws (B.A.LL.B) only when he has successfully completed all the prescribed courses in para No. 3 and obtained a minimum CGPA of 5.00 out of 10.00 and after payment of prescribed fee for receive a degree signed by the Vice-chancellor.
- 14. The result of the successful candidates shall be classified as follows:

i. First Division with Distinction: CGPA from8.00 and above

ii. First Division: CGPA from 6.67 to 7.99

iii. Second Division: CGPA from 5.56 to 6.66

iv. Pass Division: CGPA from 5.00 to 5.55

14. Award of Medals and Merit Certificates: Candidates who appear and Pass the examination in all the papers of each and every semester at first appearance only shall be eligible for the award of Medals/ Prizes/Rank Certificates etc.
