“DIRECTION PRESCRIBING EXAMINATIONS LEADING TO THE AWARD OF FOUR YEAR BACHELOR OF ARTS (B.A.) EIGHT SEMESTER DEGREE (AS PER NEP’2020) UNDER FACULTY OF HUMANITIES, DIRECTION, 2025”

Whereas, The Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 (VI of 2017) has come into force from 1st March 2017;

AND

Whereas, Gondwana University (hereinafter “the University”) is now being governed by The Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 (VI of 2017) (hereinafter the Act);

AND

Whereas, in the meetings of all Boards of Studies under the Faculty of Humanities it is resolved to restructure all the under graduate programmes of the faculty in tune with National Education Policy 2020, and decided to adopt curriculum as per State Government Higher and Technical Education Department Government resolution No. एनईपी-२०२२/प्र क्र.०९/विधि-३ शिकानामंत्रालय, मुंबई ४०००३२, दिनांक १६ मे, २०२३ including the change in the nomenclature of the programmes. All the Boards of Studies have submitted the draft scheme of examinations, syllabus and other details of these programmes to be introduced in the various Semester of the restructured programmes;

AND

Whereas, the draft scheme of examinations, syllabus and other details of these programmes prepared and approved by the respective Board of Studies of the Faculty of Humanities in its meeting dated 26 September, 2024 on behalf of the Faculty and Academic Council, the Vice-Chancellor has accepted the draft submitted by all the Board of Studies under the Faculty of Humanities;

AND

Whereas, the different graduate programs in the Faculty of Humanities (Bachelor of Arts) are till date governed through different Ordinances and Directions, in order to bring uniformity in the process of admission, ATKT, Scheme of examination, all the board of studies in these subjects have agreed to have a uniform direction/ordinance governing all the Bachelor of Arts programs in the University;

AND

Whereas, as per the National Education Policy 2020 and the Gazette of the nomenclature of programmes as published by the University Grants Commission in 2014, it is necessary to issue a direction stating the nomenclature, scheme of examination, evaluation, award of the degree and other details of the degree of Bachelor of Arts (B.A.), with the approval of competent authorities of Gondwana University, Gadchiroli;

AND

Whereas, Ordinance is required to be framed for the governance of Admissions and Examinations in any program but it takes time to frame an Ordinance and there is an urgency to bring into effect the changes in the Bachelor of Arts Programs;

Now, therefore, I, Dr. Prashant S. Bokare, Vice-Chancellor, Gondwana University, Gadchiroli in exercise of the powers vested in me under Section 12(8) of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 do hereby issue the following direction:

1. This direction shall be called **“DIRECTION PRESCRIBING EXAMINATIONS LEADING TO THE AWARD OF FOUR YEAR BACHELOR OF ARTS (B.A.) EIGHT SEMESTER DEGREE (AS PER NEP’2020) UNDER FACULTY OF HUMANITIES, DIRECTION, 2025”**.
2. This Direction shall come into force from the academic session 2024-25.
3. **Interpretation Clause:** In this direction, unless the context requires otherwise the words, phrases and abbreviations used shall have the following meaning:
 - a. **“Academic Council”** means Academic Council of Gondwana University, Gadchiroli.
 - b. **“ATKT”** means allowed to keep term in higher semester.
 - c. **“Board of Studies”** means Board of Studies for various subjects of Arts under the faculty of humanities in the University.
 - d. **“CC”** means Core Course
 - e. **“CA”** means Continuous Internal Evaluation which refers to the Internal Assessment done at college/institute level.
 - f. **“Competent Authority”** (for admission purpose) means an “Authority” established or assigned the duty to regulate admissions in the course by the Government of Maharashtra or an authority constituted by the University, for this purpose.
 - g. **“Credit Point”(G)** It is the product of grade point and number of credits for a course.
 - h. **“Credit” (C)** A unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching (lecture or tutorial) or two hours of practical work/field work per week.
 - i. **“Course”** means a paper/subject (theory or practical) prescribed for any semester of the programme.

- j. **“Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)”** It is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a student over all semesters (four semesters). The CGPA is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses in all semesters and the sum of the total credits of all courses in all the semesters. It is expressed up to two decimal places.
- k. **“DSE”** means Discipline Specific Elective Course
- l. **“Degree”** means the Under Graduate Degree awarded after successful completion of the programme governed by this Direction.
- m. **“Fees”** means the fees prescribed by the University/Shikshan Shulka Samiti of Government of Maharashtra, for the Under Graduate Programme under this Direction, from time to time.
- n. **“Grade Letter”** is an index of the performance of students in a said course. Grades are denoted by letters O, A+, A, B+, B, C, P and F.
- o. **“Grade Point”** It is a numerical weight allotted to each letter grade on a 10-point scale.
- p. **“Bachelor Programme”** means Bachelor degree programme in Arts.
- q. **“MOOC”** means Massive Open Online Course offered by SWAYAM/NPTEL or any other recognized University or Institution or Platform.
- r. **“SEC”** means Skill Enhancement Course.
- s. **“Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)”** It is a measure of performance of work done in a semester. It is ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses registered in a semester and the total course credits taken during that semester. It shall be expressed up to two decimal places.
- t. **“Student”** means student admitted to Bachelors’ degree programme in Arts under this direction.
- u. **“ODL”** means Online Distance Learning
- v. **“University”** means Gondwana University, Gadchiroli.

4. **Details of eligibility for B. A. Semester – I Examination:**

A) For the B.A. 1st Semester, Examinee shall have Passed the 12th Standard Examination of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education/CBSE/ICSE, with English at Higher or Lower level and any Modern Indian Language at higher or lower level with any combination of optional subjects;

OR

B) XII Standard Examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education in Vocational Stream with one language only; OR any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto; in such subjects and with such standards of attainments as may be prescribed Minimum Competition vocation course (MCVC).

OR

C) Any other Equivalent Examination of any State in (10+2) pattern with any combination of subjects.

2. Duration of the Program, student progression path and provisions for Multiple Entry and Exit

a. Duration of the B. A. Program shall be FOUR years with the provision for multiple exits as mentioned here:

a. A student can exit the program after successful completion of 1st and 2nd semesters having earned requisite number of credits as mentioned in the scheme of examination and additional 'Skill Enhancement Course' with 4 credits. Such a student shall be eligible for the award of 'UG Certificate in Bachelor of Arts' by the University.

OR a student can continue the program in 2nd year.

b. A student can exit the program after successful completion of 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th semesters having earned requisite number of credits as mentioned in the scheme of examination and additional 'Skill Enhancement Course' with 4 credits. Such a student shall be eligible for the award of 'UG Diploma in Bachelor of Arts' by the University.

OR a student can continue the program in 3rd year.

c. A student can exit the program after successful completion of 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th semesters having earned requisite number of credits as mentioned in the scheme of examination. Such a student shall be eligible for the award of 'Bachelor of Arts' degree by the University.

OR a student can continue the program in 4th year for either HONOURS or RESEARCH degree.

d. A student, on successful completion of all the 8 semesters and having earned requisite number of credits as mentioned in the scheme of examination shall be eligible for the award of either 'Bachelor of Arts (Honours) Degree with Major and Minor' OR 'Bachelor of Arts (Research) Degree with Major and Minor'

b. Re-entry or Lateral Entry

a. Students, opting for exits at any level, will have the option to re-enter the programme from where they have left off, in the same or in a different higher education institution within three years of exit and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of SEVEN years from the date of admission to first year.

b. Re-entry at various levels for lateral entrants in academic programmes shall be based on the earned and valid credits as deposited and accumulated in the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) through Registered Higher Education Institutions and proficiency test records.

c. Lateral entry into the programme of study leading to the UG Diploma / Three Year UG Degree / Four Year Bachelor's Degree with Honours/Research will be based on the validation of prior learning outcomes achieved and subject to availability seats based on intake capacity.

3. Types of Courses

A student admitted to this program is required to undergo and successfully complete the following types of courses as mentioned in the scheme of examination:

Sr. No.	Course Type	Choice for Selection
1	Major Subject	A student is required to select 2 'MAJOR' subjects from Group-I from amongst the choices provided in this scheme of examination for the 1 st semester as per Annexure-I and from Group-II from amongst the choices provided in this scheme of examination for the 2 nd semester as per Annexure-VII. The last date for selection of 'Major' subject may be decided by the college but it shall not be later than 15 days after commencement of classes for that Semester. Change of major subject shall not be permitted after the examination form is submitted. A student should continue the same 'MAJOR' in all semesters
2	Open Elective Course (OE)	A student is required to select an 'OPEN ELECTIVE' from the 'Open Elective Basket' (Annexure-II, Group-I for semester I and Annexure-VIII for semester II.) of the given program offered by the university. Such an 'OPEN ELECTIVE' cannot be selected from the subjects chosen by a student as 'Major' subjects. OR

		<p>A student is allowed to earn credits for 'OPEN ELECTIVE' by successfully completing online courses of equivalent credits from SWAYAM/NPTEL learning platforms or institute of national repute like IITs, IIMs, IISCs, IIITs, NITs. However, this needs to be informed by a student to the university through college before commencement of the semester and an application for transfer of credits is required to be made by student.</p> <p>If a student completes an 'OPEN ELECTIVE' from other faculty or online learning platform having more than 2 credits, it will be considered equivalent to 2 credits in this program</p>
3	Vocational Skill Course (VSC)	<p>A student is required to successfully complete the 'VOCATIONAL SKILL COURSE' based on the core subject and as mentioned in this scheme of examination appended herewith as Annexure-III, Group-I for semester I and Annexure-IX for semester II. This course must be a course corresponding to the 'MAJOR' selected by a student.</p> <p>OR</p> <p>A student is allowed to earn credits for 'VOCATIONAL SKILL COURSE' by successfully completing online courses of equivalent credits from SWAYAM/NPTEL learning platforms. However, this needs to be informed by student to the university through college before commencement of the semester and an application for transfer of credits is required to be made by student.</p>
4	Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)	<p>A student is required to select a 'SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSE' from the basket provided by the university for this purpose appended herewith as Annexure-IV for semester I and Annexure-X for semester II. A separate notification and guidelines in this regard shall be displayed by the university on its website.</p> <p>OR</p> <p>A student is allowed to earn credits for 'SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSE' by successfully completing online courses of equivalent credits from SWAYAM/NPTEL learning platforms or the courses from 'Sector Skill Council.' However, this needs to be informed by student to the university through</p>

		college before commencement of the semester and an application for transfer of credits is required to be made by student.
5	Value Education Course (VEC)	A student is required to undergo and successfully complete the 'VALUE EDUCATION COURSE' as mentioned in this scheme of examination appended herewith as Annexure-V for semester I and Annexure-XI for semester II.
6	Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)	A student is required to undergo and successfully complete the 'ABILITY ENHANCEMENT COURSE' as mentioned in this scheme of examination appended herewith as Annexure-VI for semester I and Annexure-XII for semester II.
7	Indian Knowledge System Course (IKS)	A student is required to undergo and successfully complete the 'INDIAN KNOWLEDGE SYSTEM COURSE' as offered in this course and mentioned in the scheme of examination.
8	Co-Curricular Course (CC)	A student is required to select a 'Co-Curricular Course' from amongst the basket provided under the direction/regulation governing B. A. Program. This course must be completed at the college where the student has taken admission and transfer of credit is not permissible for this type of the course.

4. All colleges affiliated to the University offering B. A. Program are required to put up a list of 'Major' core subjects it is offering on the Notice Board as well as on the website of the college to make students aware about the availability of subjects. Moreover, colleges are expected to define and display the 'Standard Operating Procedures' for the college staff members and students to facilitate the process of selecting 'Major' core subjects.

NOTES:

- Total intake capacity for the program as approved by the university shall remain the same and be divided amongst the 'Major' programs allowed for B. A.
- The COLLEGE may offer a particular 'Major' subject depending on the availability of students and teachers.
- The COLLEGE is not expected to force any student to opt for a particular subject where a choice is provided in the scheme of examination.

5. **Selection of 'Major' Subject**

A student admitted to this program is required to select any one of the subjects/programs (Refer Annexure-I and VII) as 'Major' core subjects as offered by the admitting college and is required to undergo and successfully complete the 'Core' courses as mentioned in the scheme of examination of the selected 'Major' core subjects.

6. **Availability of 'Major' and 'Intake Capacity'**

All colleges affiliated to the University for offering **Bachelor of Arts (B. A.)** Program/s in the Faculty of Humanities shall have their intake as approved by Gondwana University, Gadchiroli.

7. All colleges affiliated to the University offering B. A. Program are required to put up a list of 'Major' core subjects it is offering on the Notice Board as well as on the website of the college to make students aware about the availability of subjects. Moreover, colleges are expected to define and display the 'Standard Operating Procedures' for the college faculty members and students to facilitate the process of selecting 'Major' core subjects.

8. In pursuance with the National Education Policy 2020 and a Government Resolution No. NEP-2022/प्र.क्र.09/विशी-3/शिकाना dated 16th May 2023 issued by the Government of Maharashtra, the credit framework for B. A. Program shall be as decided by respective Board of Studies in the Faculty of Humanities.

9. **Teaching and Examination Scheme**

Teaching and Examination Schemes for all available 'Major' subjects for Bachelor of Arts (B. A.) degree are appended in **Annexure – A and B.**

10. **Grade Conversion Table and Computation of SGPA and CGPA**

Note: -When students take audit courses, they may be given pass (P) or fail (F) grade without any credits.

Computation of SGPA & CGPA:

The UGC recommends the following procedure to compute the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):

i. The SGPA is the ratio of sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student, i.e

$$SGPA (S_i) = \frac{\sum(C_i \times G_i)}{\sum C_i}$$

Where, C_i is the number of credits of the i^{th} course and G_i is the grade point scored by the student in the i^{th} course.

ii. The CGPA is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a programme, i.e.

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum(C_i \times S_i)}{\sum C_i}$$

Where S_i is the SGPA of the i^{th} semester and C_i is the total number of credits in that semester.

iii. The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points

iv. CGPA to Percentage (%) conversion formula:

$$\text{Percentage (\%)} = (CGPA) * 10$$

11. Credit Specifications:

- a. Theory/Tutorial Courses: One hour/credit/week (a minimum of 15 hours of teaching per credit is required in a semester.
- b. Laboratory/Performance Based Courses: A minimum of 30 hours in laboratory or Performance Based activities is required in a semester. Performance based activities include Studio activities, Workshop based activities, internship, Apprenticeship, Field based learning, community engagement learning, etc.
- c. Each semester will consist of at least 15 weeks of Academic Work equivalent to 90 actual teaching days.

12. Assessment

- The final total assessment of examinees shall be made in terms of Continuous Internal Assessment (CA) for 20% component and Semester End Examination (UA) for 80% component for each THEORY course mentioned in the scheme of examination.
- The final total assessment of examinees shall be made in terms of Continuous Internal Assessment (CA) and Semester End Examination (UA) for each PRACTICAL course as mentioned in the scheme of examination.

- Expected Performance Based Activities shall consist of the following: (a) Group Discussion (b) Seminars (c) Power Point Presentations (d) Elocution (e) Debate (f) Role Play (g) Case Studies (h) Educational Games. The teacher is expected to undertake a minimum of four of the aforesaid activity.
- The CA marks will be communicated to the University at the end of each semester, but before the semester end examinations / as instructed by the university. These marks will be considered for the declaration of the results.
- The record of CA marks, evaluation & results should be maintained for a period of three year by the respective institute/college for verification by the competent authority.

13. Attainment of Course Outcomes

- a. Continuous Internal Assessment shall be carried out at college/department level in such a way the attainment of prescribed learning outcomes can be measured. The college/department concerned is required to define outcome (4-6) for every course.
- b. Semester End Examinations are conducted by the university. The question papers for these examinations are required to be set in such a way that the attainment of prescribed learning outcomes can be measured.

14. Standard of Passing

The scope of the subject, percentage of passing in Theory and Project and Internal Assessment will be governed as per following rules:

- (i) In order to pass the Bachelor of Arts (B. A.) 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th Semester Examinations, an examinee shall obtain not less than 40% (Letter Grade P) marks in each theory course/paper, taking UA & CA together. Whereas, for practical/performance-based examination an examinee shall obtain not less than 50% (Letter Grade P) marks in each practical, taking UA & CA together. Moreover, a student is required to secure not less than 50% marks in aggregate i.e., taking all courses together in order to become eligible for the award of B. A. degree.
- (ii) An examinee who is unsuccessful at the examination shall be eligible for admission to the subsequent examinations on payment of a fresh fee prescribed for the examination together with the conditions of the ordinance in force from time to time.
- (iii) The candidates who pass all the semester examinations in the first attempt are eligible for ranks.
- (iv) The results of the candidates who have passed the Semester-IV examination but not passed the lower semester examinations shall be declared as NCL (not completed lower semester examinations). Such candidates shall be eligible for the Degree only after successful completion of all the lower semester examinations.
- (v) The successful examinees at the B. A. semester IV examination shall be awarded division based on CGPA as follows:

- (vi) Provisions of **Ordinance No. 3 of 2007 of RashtrasantTukdoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur** relating to the award of Grace Marks for passing and examination, securing higher division / class and for securing distinction in subject(s) shall be applicable till the own Direction/Ordinance of Gondwana University, Gadchiroli in this regard will come into force.
- (vii) University guidelines and directions issued from time to time regarding improvement of Results, Reassessment/Revaluation and Incentive Marks shall be applicable to B.A.programs covered under this direction.

15. Rules for ATKT (Allowed to Keep Term):

An unsuccessful examinee at any semester examination shall be **ALLOWED TO KEEP TERM as per following conditions:**

Admission to Semester	Eligibility for admission and taking University Examination
Semester – I	Candidate should have passed the qualifying examination as per the relevant Direction governing the course.
Semester – II	Candidate should have completed the term of the I st semester and appeared for at least one University Theory examination paper of Semester- I.
Semester – III	Candidate should have completed the term of the II nd semester, filled the examination form of the same and has obtained exemption in 50 percentage passing heads of the I st and II nd semesters taken together.
Semester – IV	Candidate should have completed the term of the III rd semester and appeared for at least one University Theory examination paper of Semester- III.

16. Absorption of students admitted under previous directions

17. Bachelor of Arts (All Groups/Subject), under previous directions/ordinance shall not be absorbed into the scheme of examination under this direction. Hence, the university shall continue to conduct these examinations for THREE years to provide opportunities to failure students of these programs. All failure students after these additional SIX attempts will be required to take admission to 1st year of B. A. program as per this direction.

18. Provision for Transfer of Credits

The B. A. program offered under this direction provides enhanced academic flexibility to students in terms of selecting the courses they want to learn. A student can opt for any course from any statutory/recognized University or a MOOC from SWAYAM/NPTEL in lieu of a course mentioned in this scheme of examination as 'Elective' course. The mechanism for transfer of credits earned through these courses to be adhered is mentioned here:

1. Every student is mandatorily required to create an ID on Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) and shall submit her/his ID to the college.
2. Any Course mentioned in this scheme of examination under 'Elective' can be opted out by a student for taking a MOOC from SWAYAM/NPTEL learning platform.
3. A student cannot opt out any of the compulsory (Core)courses.
4. If a student is willing to opt out any 'Elective' course, he/she will have to mention this while submitting the examination form to the University for respective semester.
5. A certificate of completion of such an ODL/Online course shall be submitted by the student to the University through college before end term evaluation.
6. Such a certificate shall mandatorily have the number of credits, duration of the course and grades/marks obtained by the student and shall preferably have a QR code for verification.
7. The college shall submit the grades and marks obtained by the student to the University along with Internal Assessment marks for the concerned examination.
8. If a student has opted for an ODL/Online course in a particular semester and failed to submit the certificate within prescribed time, the student will be marked for 'Absent' for a particular course in that examination. Such a student will be required to fill in the examination form in the consecutive attempt and submit the passing certificate in order to get his/her corrected result.
9. A separate guideline 'Transfer of Credits' issued by the University will be applicable to the students of B. A. Program from the date of its issuance.
