2. Dwell upon salient features and objects of the Protection of civil rights act, 1995.

OR

‘R’ a Dalit man, was denied entry into a public park by the park authorities on the basis of his caste. ‘R’ believes that this discrimination is a violation of his civil rights. Whether the denial of entry based on his caste constitutes a violation under protection of civil rights act? Also evaluate the nature of offences under the act.

3. ‘Dowry harassment is a “pestiferous” crime – Discuss with landmark causes and define the terms dowry and dowry death.

Critically evaluate the objects of the pre-conception and pre-Natal Diagnostic techniques (Prohibition of sex selection) Act, 1995.

5. Examine the social reasons for increasing crimes of corruption in India. Cite relevant case laws.

A group of individuals from a minority community is targeted by a mob that vandalizes their homes and threatens them with violence. The victims allege that the attack was motivated by religious hatred and intolerance. Determine whether the actions of the mob constitute an offense under the prevention of Atrocities Act, 1989 and whether the victims’ religious identity was a determining factor in the attack they faced.
