Read the following passage and answer the questions that follow.

The Union Territory of Lakshadweep, earlier known as the Laccadives, is an archipelago or chain of islands in the Arabian sea, spreading over an area of 32 square km and consisting of 10 inhabited and 17 uninhabited Islands.

Malayalm is spoken on all the islands except Minicoy, where the people speak a language known as Mahl. The entire population of Lakshadweep has been classified as scheduled Tribes because of their economic and social backwardness. Ninety-three percent of the population is Muslim. The main occupations of the people are fishing, coconut cultivation and coir twisting. Tourism is an emerging industry.

The early history of Lakshadweep is largely unknown. According to local tradition, people from the mainland first settled on these islands during the time of Cheraman Perumal, the last king of Kerala, who was converted to Islam by some Arab merchants, probably in the 19th century AD. For several centuries, Lakshadweep was

ruled by the king of Cannanore (now Kannur). In the year 1783, the administration of the islands was taken over by Tipu Sultan, at the request of some of the islanders. After the battle of Seringapatam in 1799, when Tipu was defeated by the British, the islands were annexed by the East India company and were administered from Mangalore.

Lakshadweep was made a union territory in 1956 and its name was changed from Laccadives to Lakshadweep in 1973.
